#### **FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2020**



If your child is in Year 3 or above, and you would like your child to receive their First Holy Communion in June 2020 you will need to enrol them on the First Holy Communion programme.

The first enrolment date will be on **Tuesday**, **8**<sup>th</sup> **October** between 3.30pm and 5.00pm, the second enrolment date will be **Tuesday**, **15**<sup>th</sup> **October** between 6.30pm and 7.00pm. They will both be held in the Sacristy at **Our Lady of Peace Church**. The First Holy Communion classes will begin in **February 2020** and will be held at St Andrew's on Saturday mornings.

Parents will need to complete an enrolment form which will be available at the enrolment meeting. The maximum amount of children we can take is 88. If we reach that number by Sunday, 10<sup>th</sup> November which will be the deadline date for any enrolments, then any latecomers will have to wait until 2021. If your child was Baptised in another Parish, you will need to bring with you a copy of the child's Baptism certificate: if you cannot find it, you will need to contact the Parish where your child was Baptised and obtain it before the enrolment meeting. **This information can also be found on our website, under parent information, First Holy Communion 2020.** 

### **Solemnity of All Saints**

All Saints' Day (also known as All Hallows' Day or Hallowmas) is the day after All Hallows' Eve (Hallowe'en). It is a feast day celebrated on 1st November by Anglicans and Roman Catholics.

It is an opportunity for believers to remember all saints and martyrs, known and unknown, throughout Christian history. As part of this day of obligation, believers are required to attend church and try not to do any servile work.

Remembering saints and martyrs and dedicating a specific day to them each year has been a Christian tradition since the 4th century AD, but it wasn't until 609AD that Pope Boniface IV decided to remember *all* martyrs. Originally 13th May was designated as the Feast of All Holy Martyrs. Later, in 837AD, Pope Gregory IV extended the festival to remember all the saints, changed its name to Feast of All Saints and changed the date to 1st November.

We will be celebrating All Saints Day on **Friday 8th November** and ask that your children come into school dressed as Saints. We would be grateful for a £1 donation which will go towards replacing the RE artefacts in the classrooms. Thank you.



#### Holiday during Term Time

May we remind you that <u>NO</u> holiday will be authorised at any time during term time and 5 days of absence or more will incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

Any absences attached to a School holiday will need to be backed up with medical evidence, i.e. either an appointment card from the Doctor's surgery to say your child has been seen and please make sure this is dated for the day of absence or proof provided of any prescribed medication. This can be brought to the School Office on your child's return. Without this, your child's absence will be marked as unauthorised and again, if your child is away for 5 days or more (*including either side of a School holiday*), this could incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.
