At home: If you would like your child to write in Christmas cards for your family and friends, make sure you give them plenty of time and do a few each day as it is tiring for them to concentrate on writing for a long time.	Letter Sounds of the Week We are introducing phonics to the children using Ruth Miskin cards. These will be displayed in your child's classroom for you to look at. This week we will be revising all of the letter sounds by playing Phonic Christmas Bingo! At home: This is a great game to play with your children over the Christmas holidays. It can be letters or numbers and there are some downloadable ones on the internet for you to print out (or get the children to help you make your own). Understanding the World People and Communities We would like to talk to the children about how people around the world celebrate Christmas in different ways. The children in our Reception classes come from a wide range of family backgrounds and it would be nice to hear about your family traditions. Please write a short note describing a tradition that we can share with the children. As an example, when I was a little girl we always opened our Christmas presents on Christmas morning as soon as we got up. Some of my friends opened their presents after lunch and I know that in some countries presents are opened on Christmas Eve.	Christmas Creativity At last the children can start their Advent calendars! Each class will have their own Advent calendar and it will help children to recognise order and count up to 25. When the children return to school on Monday their classrooms will be decorated for the celebration of Christmas. At this time of year it is important to keep a structure and routine to the day and that behaviour expectations remain the same. We will be talking to the children about their feelings of excitement, hope and love for friends and family. At home: Over the next couple of weeks try to keep your child's routine the same as usual. The added excitement of Christmas, on top of the tiredness of a long term, can sometimes lead to some challenging behaviour.
