

## Main objectives for your children for this year

- ⇒ Gaining increasing independence for their own personal organisation and learning
- ⇒ Developing high expectations for their own work and behaviour and always doing their very best
- ⇒ Building on/reinforcing basic skills, including number bonds, times table facts, spelling patterns, handwriting, basic punctuation

#### The school day

In the mornings the children will enter the school building via the KS2 playground between 8.45am-9.05am. If your child needs to be left earlier, we run a breakfast club. Please contact the school office for details.

In the afternoon, the children will be dismissed at 3:00pm from the KS2 playground. We will not dismiss your child until we see you, or someone you have authorised to collect your child. Please notify the school office if anyone other than yourself is collecting your child. If you are running late, children should be collected from the school office.

## <u>Maths</u>

Maths and English is taught every morning.

Maths is taught in a whole-class environment, where pupils' differing needs are catered for through differentiated activities and effective questioning from the class teacher. Lessons will focus on the pupils' fluency in maths (rapid and accurate recall of number facts) as well as providing them with the opportunity to build a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts by developing their skills in reasoning and problem-solving.

## <u>Reading</u>

Children are grouped into guided reading groups based on their reading ability, working with the class teacher. Please do encourage your children to read regularly and note this in their reading record. We do enjoy reading comments from parents about their children's reading. Reading diaries will be checked on a weekly basis to ensure that all children, regardless of reading ability, are reading regularly. We encourage all children to have a reading book of their choice with them in school for when we have quiet reading time. All children will also have the opportunity to choose books from the library with the support of the class LSA once per week, on an allocated day.

### <u>Homework</u>

As a result of the feedback from parents, pupils and staff and extensive reading of national research, we have now reviewed our homework procedures for September 2020. Moving forward our aim is that our school homework provides opportunities for the children to practise key skills and consolidate their learning as well as provide teachers the time to plan and deliver first class lessons every day.

As from September, homework will be split into two categories; Formal Homework and Informal Homework.

1) Formal Homework will come into school on the designated days as specified by the class teacher.

Pupils will be tested on their spellings weekly and will be provided with a spelling booklet half termly which will support them with their learning of the spellings. The spelling booklet does not need to come into school and we encourage our parents to check their child's spellings at home.

Multiplication tables will also be tested on a weekly basis.

Brain Builders project work will be marked by the class teacher.

2) Informal Homework is optional homework and does not need to come into school as this will be completed at home.

#### Pencil Cases

It is always very exciting to bring a pencil case into school; however, these can often become a distraction during learning times. In Year 3, children are not required to bring a pencil case to school. Any equipment for lessons will be provided by the class teacher.

## <u>Water Bottles</u>

It is very important that the children drink regularly during the day. Please provide your child with a named clear sport's style water bottle (no screw caps) containing only water. We have drinking water facilities in every classroom to allow your child to refill their bottles.

## <u>PE Kits</u>

The children have an indoors PE and outside Games lesson once a week. Children can wear their PE kit to school on the allocated day. The PE kit includes a sensible pair of trainers/plimsolls. If your child is in school, they will be expected to participate in games lessons unless a suitable reason is provided by parents.

## <u>Uniform</u>

Make sure everything is named, we prefer no earrings, but if they are worn, they should be silver or gold studs. Children are not allowed to wear earrings for PE, so they must be able to remove them without any adult help. Hair accessories should be simple and in school colours and children are expected to tie long hair back with a plain, school coloured hair tie. During hot weather, please provide your child with a sun hat.
