
Mark 10:13-16- Anyone wishing to enter the kingdom of God, must first become like one of these little children.



Jesus had been preaching all day and his disciples knew that he was feeling tired. When they saw a group of children coming and heard their excited chatter and laughter, they wanted them to go away and let Jesus have some peace and quiet.

He scolded the disciples for trying to send the children away, Jesus wanted to spend time with them talking and listening to what they had to say. The children were just as important as the grown-ups.

Have you ever found that sometimes grownups are too busy or tired to listen to you and you feel like you are getting in their way? At such times it can be very difficult to get their attention and make them really listen to what you have to say. Perhaps sometimes you are too busy to listen carefully to what people are saying to you. Think about this for a few moments. How do you feel when you are not listened to?

Jesus was never too busy or tired to listen to children, even though Jesus felt tired, he did not send the children away and he was always ready to listen to them as they were important.

Jesus said that grown ups need to become more like children to enter the kingdom of God. Children know that Jesus is a special friend who is never too busy to listen to them. Grownups should remember to love and listen to Jesus like children do. If they do this their lives will be pleasing to God and they will share eternal life with him in the kingdom of Heaven.

Let us all take a few moments now to reflect on how we treat other people, do we listen well? Do we respect all the adults that teach us? Do we respect and treat everybody equally?
