#### **Important Notice**

There was an incident yesterday involving a child who nearly got ran over. This is not acceptable as you can imagine how upsetting it was for the pupil and the parents. We have sent numerous requests out regarding the parking issues outside of the school especially emphasising how the parking can endanger the safety of children, other road users and pedestrians.

Please be reminded that when dropping off and picking up your child/children:

- *Vehicles MUST always be parked legally so as not to cause an obstruction.*
- •Please do not block residents' drives, even for 'just a minute'.
- •Please do not simply pull alongside the parked cars outside the School to allow your children to 'jump in'.
