We look forward to seeing you all on the 30th November so make sure the date is in your diary!





INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION WEEK 2019



On Tuesday 19th November, all children attended an assembly about "**INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION WEEK**" led by Mme DHISSI.

We watched a short extract of a French documentary "<u>Sur le chemin de l'école" (On the way to School</u>) which tells the incredible story of 4 children (from Kenya, India, Morocco, Argentina) whose journey to school is extremely treacherous. These 4 children all strive <u>to get an education</u> to support their families.

The pupils were then challenged with questions about languages around the world only to find out that the most spoken language in the world is Chinese and not English!

We all eagerly listened to <u>6 schools</u> around the world singing the same song "A million dreams" using the <u>MAKATON sign language</u>: a wonderful way to get together during International Education Week!

Last but not least, "15 million girls of primary education age will never have the opportunity to learn to read and write", the final words were given to Malala Yousafzai, the youngest Nobel Peace Prize recipient with her speech presented to the United Nations in support of girls' education.

"One child, one teacher, one book and one pen can change the world. Education is the only solution"







The parent app - easy access to important school information

We have a convenient way to share information with you about your child's school life. From 11th March 2019 you have been able to access our parent app and website.

You can access the system from a smartphone, tablet or PC – anytime, anywhere.

What will you find in the SIMS Parent app:

• Access to update your contact details, telephone numbers, address, dietary needs or medical needs, so we always have the most up-to-date information in case of emergency

If you have more than one child at school, you'll have access to information for all your children, from the same app.

Getting started with the SIMS Parent app

We will send you an activation email, simply click on the link from your tablet, PC or smartphone to activate your account. You can then login using your normal **Facebook, Twitter, Google** or **Microsoft** username and password. From your smartphone or tablet, download the app from the Google Play or Apple App store - search for **SIMS Parent.** From a PC or Windows phone, login online at www.sims-parent.co.uk

If you are unable to use the app or access the Parent App and need to update your details, please contact the office to arrange a time to collect a data collection sheet for you to update.

Please note that your activation email is unique to you and should not be used by anyone else. If you require an additional login then please contact the school office.

Your activation email will expire after 14 days if it is not used, please contact the school office if you require a replacement after this date.



Free School Meals

Help your school and yourself - claim free school meals

Taking up free school meals has benefits for everyone:

- · children get a healthy nutritious meal
- · schools can benefit directly by receiving £1300 for each eligible primary school child

WHO QUALIFIES FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are offered to children of families who receive:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseeker Allowance (IBJSA)
- Employment & Support Allowance (Income Related) (ESA(RI))
- Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (TC602) that does not exceed income of £16190.00.
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit (M1000 Award Notice)
- ◆ Universal Credit and my family's net income excluding any benefit related payments is less than £7,400.

HOW TO APPLY FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

If you think you qualify for free school meals and have an email address or mobile number then you can apply through Slough Boroughs Councils online <u>free school meals form</u>. Slough Borough Council will then inform you if your application is successful or not.

If you do not have an email address or a mobile number then you can get a 'free school meals' application form from your child's/children's school. The school will then inform you if your application is successful or not.

Once you are eligible for free school meals, you are more likely to remain eligible for up to 2 years despite any changes to your circumstances.

Not claiming benefits, but have a child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2?

There are clear advantages in pupils having a school dinner, so the Government have announced that every child in the above year groups will be eligible for a free meal under the Universal Free School Meals scheme.

You can <u>apply online</u> or pick up a registration form from your child's school.

If your child is absent from school for any reason please email attendance@olopprimary.co.uk or leave a telephone message selecting option 2.

Can we please remind you that all planned medical and dental appointments, should be made for after school or during school holidays. Taking children to appointments during learning time, can have a huge impact on the class, teacher and school office in facilitating these appointments. The school understands that this isn't always possible, however, pupils should attend school prior to or following a medical or dental appointment and avoid a full day's absence.

Holiday during Term Time

May we remind you that **NO** holiday will be authorised at any time during term time and 5 days of absence or more will incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

Any absences attached to a School holiday will need to be backed up with medical evidence, i.e. either an appointment card from the Doctor's surgery to say your child has been seen and please make sure this is dated for the day of absence or proof provided of any prescribed medication. This can be brought to the School Office on your child's return. Without this, your child's absence will be marked as unauthorised and again, if your child is away for 5 days or more (*including either side of a School holiday*), this could incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

The whole school attendance should be 95% or higher on a regular week. All children should aim for an attendance of 98-100% though as a school we do recognise that children may become unwell so will be absent from school.
