We recently had a RE Audit and we have now received the report back. The report is a true reflection of where the school is currently and shows that the children were highly engaged during their RE learning which was evident when walking around the school and also in the children's books. # **Attendance**

Students **must** arrive at school by 8.55am.

Late students should sign in at Reception before going to their lessons.

If students are unable to attend school for any reason then parents need to telephone the school reception on **(01753)** 661886 on the first day of absence by **9.00am**. Each absence needs to be covered by a letter from home even if a telephone call has been made. If your child is absent from school you must telephone the school to give a reason why. The school has an absence line where you can record your child's name, class and the reason for your child's absence and when they are likely to return. If the Attendance Officer is concerned about the frequency of absence, parents or the EWO will be contacted to share concerns.

Medical and dental appointments should be made outside of the school day unless it is an emergency. If students need to leave school to attend an emergency appointment then they will not be allowed to leave school unless collected by a parent or an authorised adult over the age of 18 years.

Dentist/doctors appointment times must be communicated to the school office as early as possible to avoid parents coming early to collect children from school with no advance warning. All appointments should be made for afterschool or at weekends, unless it's an emergency. If your child does have an appointment that is an emergency or if they have a hospital appointment, we will need to see proof of the appointment letter.

Early departures/late arrivals will also be monitored and recorded in the office to enable us to monitor the frequency or any patterns emerging in this.

No holidays are authorised in term time.

# Holiday leave

Legislation now makes it clear that head teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Headteacher's no longer have the discretion to allow any time for a family holiday or to agree to extended leave for parents to visit their country of origin. While we appreciate that it can be more expensive to go away in the holiday periods, this ultimately means losing valuable school time. If your child is absent from school due to a holiday which has not been agreed, this will be classified as an unauthorised absence, and you may be fined or legal action taken against you.

# **Attendance Facts**

- The Local Authority regards 95% as the minimum satisfactory attendance for Our Lady of Peace Catholic Primary School.
- 90% attendance is like having a day off every two weeks.
- Keeping children away from school for no good reason is a criminal offence
- 80% attendance is the same as having a day off every week
- Most children should routinely have attendance rates of 97% or more. This is the equivalent of 6 days absence a year. BUT 100% is achieved by many pupils every year in primary schools.
- If you take a two week holiday in term time your child's attendance will automatically be reduced to less than 95% and this is without sickness.
