Jesus Appears to His Disciples

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! **As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."** And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Now Thomas one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!"

But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Reflection

When Jesus appeared to His disciples after the Resurrection He offered them the gifts of peace, the Holy Spirit and forgiveness. Those same gifts from Jesus are given to us at Baptism - forgiveness of our sins, the Holy Spirit, and peace. We are called to be witnesses to Christ by our words and actions every single day.

The apostle Thomas represents those of us who are sceptical about religion, doubtful and hot-headed. Thomas is intelligent and he asks for proof. He is seeking an understanding of his faith. When he finally encounters Jesus, he believes.
