Nursery Parent Planning Week Beginning 16th November 2020

Maths


We teach the children rhymes to support the correct number formation.

R.E

The children will be learning about different religions. We will be talking about different faiths and our own beliefs. We will be talking about Judaism and listening to the story of the oil lamp in the Temple.

We will be thinking about special days we like to celebrate and we will be listening to some new songs relating to different days of the week.

At home: Talk about special days you celebrate as a family.



Around the tree and around the tree. That's the way we make a three.

At home: Practise the number formation rhymes for 0, 1, 2, 3. Everyone took home a number rhyme sheet this week to use at home.

Voice Sounds

We will be exploring different mouth movements like tongue stretches and wiggling. Practising these movements regularly to music can be fun and helps children with articulation.

At home: Continue to make fun mouth movements and sounds such as making your voice go down a slide - wheee! Hiss like a snake – ssss! Look astonished - oooo! Be a clock – tick tock!

Make your own horn or trumpet using recycled materials such as kitchen roll tubes. paper or boxes and explore voice sounds with your child.



Rhythm and Rhyme

We have been listening to rhyming stories, nursery rhymes and using rhyming pots which contain objects that rhyme (e.g. hat, bat, cat)

We played an online game this week too where the children had to listen to words and work out which words rhyme.

At home: Continue to share rhyming stories with your child and put emphasis on the rhyming words.

The children will be learning the rhyme Incy Wincy Spider. They will be making up their own actions to the rhyme and performed it in their key groups to their friends.

At home: Practise singing the rhyme together with the actions. Ask your child to show the actions they have made up for the rhyme. Talk about what a Nursery rhyme is and what other rhymes do they know.
