<u>Main objectives for your children this year</u>

- To work independently
- Remember and keep the Golden rules: Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Ready
- Developing academic skills, including extended pieces of writing and solving Maths reasoning questions.

<u>The school day</u>

In the mornings the children will enter the school building via the KS1 playground between 8.45am-9.05am. If your child needs to be left earlier, we run a breakfast club. Please contact the school office for details.

In the afternoon, the children will be dismissed at 3:10pm. We will not dismiss your child until we see you, or someone you have authorised to collect your child. Please notify the school office if anyone other than yourself is collecting your child. If you are running late, children should be collected from the school office.

Maths and English

Children in Year 2 have Maths and English every morning.

We learn to write in different genres throughout the year, children are taught neat, cursive, handwriting skills.

Within Maths we explore and learn different concepts for the 4 key operations, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Maths is taught in a whole-class environment, where pupils' differing needs are catered for through differentiated activities and effective questioning from the class teacher. Lessons will focus on the pupils' fluency in maths (rapid and accurate recall of number facts) as well as providing them with the opportunity to build a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts by developing their skills in reasoning and problem-solving. Children will need

to know number bonds to 10, 20 and 100, practicing these facts with your child will support their learning and fluency in Maths.

<u>Reading</u>

Reading is a vital skill, in Year 2 children will be given a reading book, progressing through the reading scheme. Please find time to hear your child read daily.

Phonics

Phonic development is a key stage of your child's learning. Phonics provides children will the means of developing their reading and writing. Children will continue to learn new grapeme-phoeme correspondences, revising and consolidating those learnt in Year 1. Using this knowledge to decode words into known sounds while reading, likewise using these sounds to encode words in their writing.

<u>Homework</u>

Schools across the nation have been reviewing their homework policies, and evaluating the impact homework has on pupil progress. The national research proves that homework does not have an impact on academic progress at primary school level and that schools should be focussing their time on providing first class teaching and learning during the school day. The research also comments that pupils between the ages of 5 - 11 could be using home time to practise social skills and take part in extracurricular activities. School homework can provide opportunities for the children to practise key skills and consolidate their learning.

Homework booklets are given to every child to bring home each half term, these booklets give details of:

- Weekly spelling words, children are encouraged to practice the weekly word lists at home, finding ways to use these in their writing at school and home. These word lists will be used in weekly spellings tests.
- A Brain Builder project will also be set for children to complete by the end of each half term. Children are encouraged to share these projects with classmates on completion.
- Reminders and links to online learning resources.

<u>Water Bottles</u>

It is very important that the children drink regularly during the day. Please provide your child with a named clear sport's style water bottle (no screw caps) containing only water. We have drinking water facilities in every classroom to allow your child to refill their bottles.

<u>PE Kits</u>

The children have an indoors PE and outside Games lesson once a week. Children can wear their PE kit to school on the allocated day. The PE kit includes a sensible pair of trainers/plimsolls. If your child is in school, they will be expected to participate in games lessons unless a suitable reason is provided by parents.

<u>Uniform</u>

Please ensure all clothing, footwear and bags are clearly labelled with your child's name. According to the school uniform policy we prefer no earrings, but if they are worn, they should be silver or gold studs. Children are not allowed to wear earrings for PE, so children must be able to remove earrings independently. When possible please ensure your child changes their uniform every day. Hair accessories should be simple and in school colours and long hair should be tied up. During hot weather, please provide your child with a sun hat.
