Holiday during Term Time

May we remind you that **NO** holiday will be authorised at any time during term time and 5 days of absence or more will incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

Any absences attached to a School holiday will need to be backed up with medical evidence, i.e. either an appointment card from the Doctor's surgery to say your child has been seen and please make sure this is dated for the day of absence or proof provided of any prescribed medication. This can be brought to the School Office on your child's return. Without this, your child's absence will be marked as unauthorised and again, if your child is away for 5 days or more (*including either side of a School holiday*), this could incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

<u>Norovirus</u>

INFORMATION FROM SLOUGH BOUROUGH COUNCIL PUBLIC HEALTH

We are now well and truly into the winter season. The cold weather is setting in and there have been several outbreaks of the "winter vomiting bug", also known as norovirus, within Slough. One of the best ways to protect against it is by practicing good hygiene. For more information on diarrhoea and vomiting please check this <u>NHS webpage</u>.

Washing your hands is one of the best ways to protect yourself and others from illnesses such as norovirus, food poisoning and flu. The NHS have created a helpful video to show children <u>how to wash their hands</u>.

If parents would like advice on how to manage a minor illness such as diarrhoea and vomiting, they can consult a pharmacist. For urgent but non-life-threatening medical conditions, parents can contact NHS 111, either online for children over five years old and via phone for those under five.


It is easy to play your part in stopping the spread of norovirus this winter – simply **Think NORO**:

- N No visits to hospitals, care homes and GP surgeries if you are suffering from symptoms of norovirus send someone else to visit loved ones until you are better.
- **0** Once you've been symptom-free for at least 48 hours, you're safe to return to work, school or visit hospitals and care homes.
- **R** Regularly wash your hands with soap and warm water, especially after using the toilet and before eating or preparing food.
- **0** Only hand-washing will prevent spread of norovirus alcohol hand gels DON'T kill the virus.

If your child is absent from school for any reason please email attendance@olopprimary.co.uk or leave a telephone message selecting option 2.

Can we please remind you that all planned medical and dental appointments, should be made for after school or during school holidays. Taking children to appointments during learning time, can have a huge impact on the class, teacher and school office in facilitating these appointments. The school understands that this isn't always possible, however, pupils should attend school prior to or following a medical or dental appointment and avoid a full day's absence.

The whole school attendance should be 95% or higher on a regular week. All children should aim for an attendance of 98-100% though as a school we do recognise that children may become unwell so will be absent from school.
