Understanding the World	Maths	RE
The children have really enjoyed learning about the world map. Thank you to those parents who spent time with their child looking at the different countries. This week we are looking at the different habitats around the world and which animals we might find living there. We will be looking at photographs and short video clips from various habitats and the children will be drawing pictures, painting pictures and writing about their favourites. At home: A visit to the library to look for non-fiction books about animals would be a fun thing to do with your child. This will promote a love of books and finding out about the world in which they live.	 This week we are looking closely at the numbers 6, 7 and 8. We will be looking at a ten frame to help the children understand that 6 is 1 more than five, 7 is 2 more than 5 and 8 is 3 more than five. We will be talking about one more and one less than these numbers and writing number lines counting up and down. The children will be making and drawing insects that have 6 legs, drawing rainbows that have seven colours and making spiders that have 8 legs. At home: When you are out and about look for these numbers on doors, buses, price tags, aisle numbers etc. Practice counting out 6,7, and objects from a larger group (crisps from a packet peas on your plate etc). 	We continue with our topic of 'Celebrating'. We have looked at the outside of different churches and looked at other places of worship such as temples and mosques. The children will be writing key words from the topic and learning about how Chinese New Year will be celebrated by the Chinese community. We have been talking about our Parish Family and how people gather together in church on Sundays, and for special occasions, to say prayers, sing songs and celebrate God's love.
