against us;

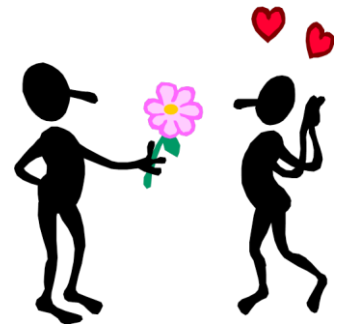
and lead us not into temptation,

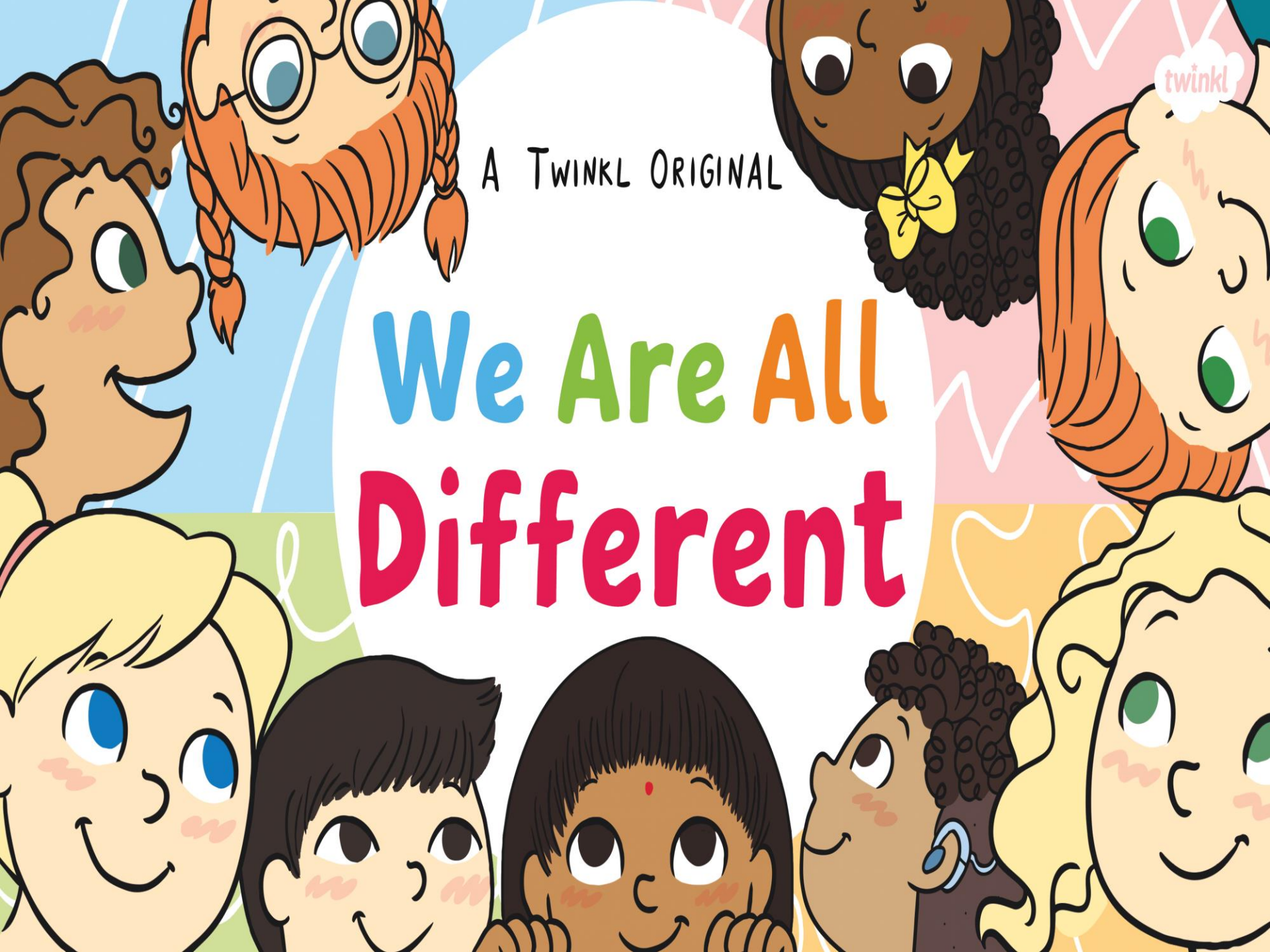

I have freckles.

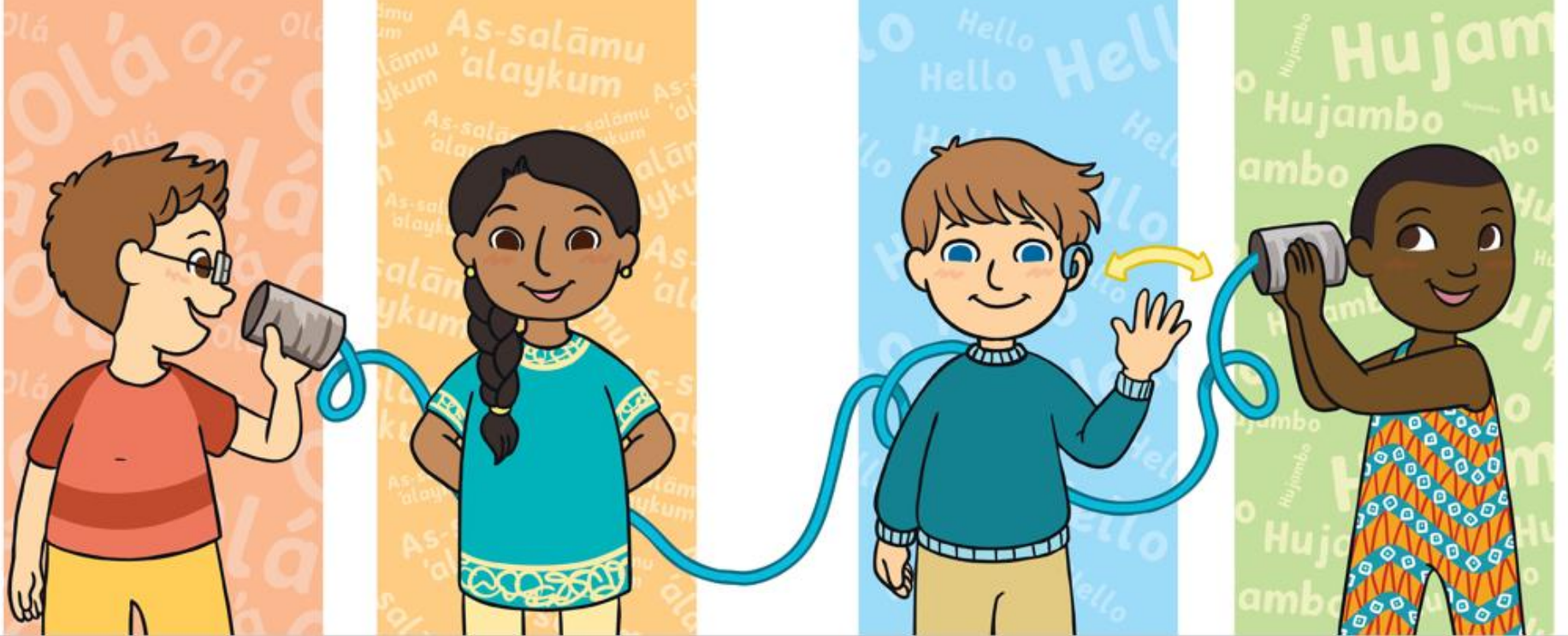


I speak Portuguese.
