We are going to be learning about
British values

- **Democracy**

Britain is a democracy - this means that the people in Britain vote for the people who make the laws and decide how the country is run. If we didn't have a democracy, just one person might be able to make all the laws and that would not be fair.

In Britain we have a police force who make sure people do not do the wrong thing and break the law - this means that we are safe.

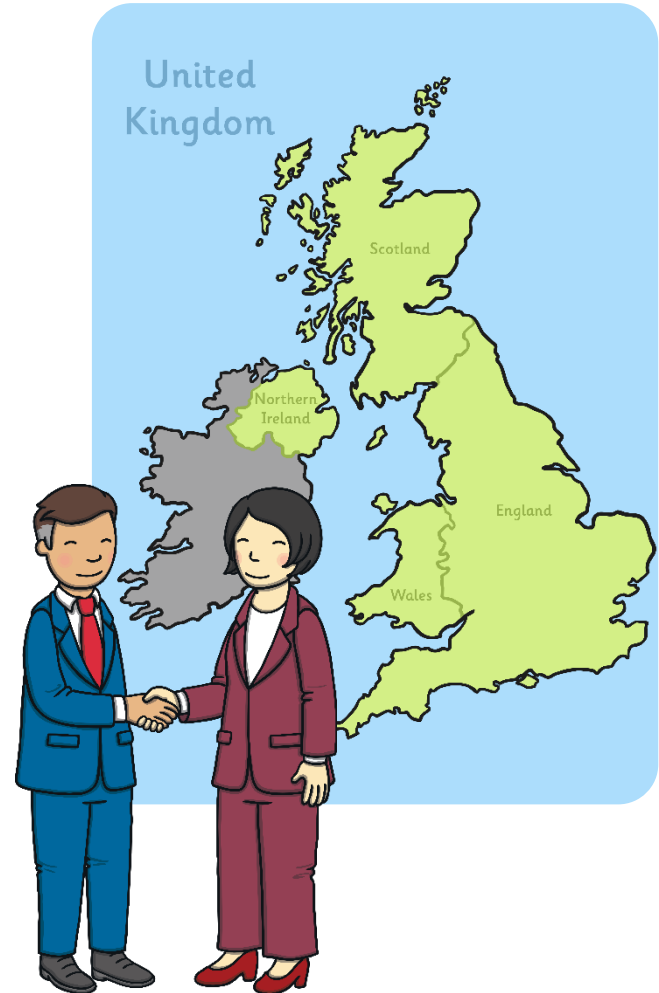
What Does Democracy Mean?

In the United Kingdom, we hold an **election** to choose someone to **represent** us.

Most **candidates** who 'stand' for election belong to a political party - a group of people who share similar beliefs.

Together, people who belong to the party agree on changes they will make if they are elected. These are called **policies**.

The leaders of the political parties share their main policies with members of the public.

- **Individual Liberty**

In Britain, as long as we do not break the law, we can live as we choose to and have our own opinions about things.

In Our Democracy, Every Citizen Has Certain Basic Rights.

No one can tell you what you must think, believe, say or not say.

Everyone is free to choose their own religion and to worship and practice their religion as they want to.

Every individual has the right to enjoy their own culture, along with other members of their group, even if their group is a minority.

However everyone must exercise these rights peacefully, with respect for the law and the rights of others.

- **Mutual Respect**

We might not always agree with other people, but we try to show respect for their thoughts and feelings.

We can give respect to others and we can expect other people to show us respect.

- **Tolerance of those of
different faiths and
beliefs**

In Britain we accept that other
people might have different beliefs
than ours and they may believe in
different religions.
