Personal, Social and Emotional	Literacy	Letter Sounds of the Week	Notes
As we come to the end of this, our first term, it is a good opportunity to reflect with the children on what they have achieved over the last few weeks. We will be looking back at all of the things we have learnt already. We will ask the children what they have enjoyed learning the most and what they think they need to learn moving forward. After the half term break the children will be going to Hymn practice assembly every Wednesday morning. They will also be bringing home a reading book. As Christmas approaches we will be putting our nativity together. All in all we are going to be very busy!	As the children become more confident with recognising and hearing the letter sounds in words, we help the children to blend sounds together to help them write words, and help them to segment words in to letter sounds to help them read. The first reading books that children will bring home will support these skills and it is important that children are secure in this before moving them through the reading scheme. It is important to understand that all children learn to read at their own pace and our job as adults is to encourage and praise them in their efforts.	<ul> <li>Letter Sounds of the week</li> <li>We are introducing phonics to the children using Ruth Miskin cards. These will be displayed in your child's classroom for you to look at. This weeks sounds are:</li> <li>h- down the head to the hooves and over his back</li> <li>b - down the laces to the heel, up and around the toe</li> <li>f - down the stem and draw the leaves</li> <li>At home: look out for these letters in the books you share with your child.
