Religious Education

Our topic this term is about celebrating. We are discussing what and why do people celebrate?

Understanding the world

Maths

The children thoroughly enjoyed counting raisins and matching them up with the correct number. I would highly recommend having a go at this activity at home as the children were asking me to add more raisins to my weekly shopping to have another go!

This week the children will be realising that anything can be counted. They will roll a dice and choose an action card.

E.g. If they roll number 5 and chose 'jumps' then they will have to do 5 jumps.

At home: Have a go at rolling a dice and recognising the number or count the dots. Make up your own actions and get the family to join in.

What to say to your child instead of "Be Careful!"

Help your child <u>foster awareness</u> by saying:

Notice how...these rocks are slippery, that branch is strong.

Do you see...the poison ivy, your friends nearby?

Try moving...your feet carefully, quickly, strongly.

Try using your...hands, feet, arms, legs.

Do you feel...stable on that rock, the heat from the fire?

Can you hear...the rushing water, the wind, the singing birds?

Are you feeling...safe, scared, excited, tired?

Help your child problem solve by saying:


What's your plan...if you climb that boulder, cross that log? What can you see...to get across, for your adventure? Where will you...put that rock, climb that tree, dig that hole? How will you...get down, go up, get across? Who will...be with you, go with you, help you if?

Literacy

The children have loved playing with a variety of animals at school.

We will continue to discuss what different animals <u>look</u> like, what they <u>sound</u> like, what they like to <u>eat</u> or drink and learn about their natural <u>habitats</u>.

We will be designing a story map as a class using the information we have learnt using information books about our favourite animals. Then the children will have a go at drawing their own.



At home: Continue to talk about a variety of animals such as sea creatures, wildlife, birds, pets etc. Look at non-fiction books to learn about interesting facts. Design your own story map.
