A Message from Bishop David

The story of the Ascension of Jesus is a rather strange one to the modern mind. I grew up in the use of the space race in the 1960s. We were used to seeing the launch of rockets from Cape Canaveral, eventually taking men to the moon. When I was your age, I used to imagine that perhaps this was the way Jesus left this earth to return to his Father. And then I learnt about space and the universe, and wondered how I could make sense of the story? No I look at this in a very different way. First of all, this day is about Jesus saying goodbye to his friends, and about the apostles saying goodbye to him. There have been several times in my life as a priest, when I have entered into this experience with the parish communities I have been privileged to serve. Just last year, I said goodbye to my diocesan family in Birmingham, in order to become the Bishop of Northampton. It is never easy to say goodbye, but when we do what Jesus asks us to do, then we find these things much easier.

Secondly, Jesus told his friends to go back to Jerusalem and to wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit. We see from the story of the Ascension, that they seemed reluctant to do this. They stand transfixed to the spot, looking up into the sky to where Jesus and gone. It takes a couple of angelic figures to move them on, to encourage them to do what Jesus asked them to do. I think this speaks to each one of us. How difficult it can be at times, to do what Jesus asks of us. Please do not be afraid, Jesus will never ask us to do something that is impossible for us.

And finally, there is something in this story which makes me think very carefully about the meaning of being a disciple of Jesus. The apostles ask our Lord, is this the moment when you are going to restore Israel. What they were really getting out is this, are you going to act in power to drive out the Romans and give us back our land? Jesus, and not for the first time, is annoyed that they do not understand what he is about. I think there are times when we want to God to act in power, not in the way he does act as a servant king, but with worldly authority.

On this great Feast day of the Ascension, may each one of us understand who Jesus is, what the Church is about, and how we can become better disciples in our world today.




Set aside some time in your day to gather together for prayer Make sure you are all sitting comfortably Light a candle



In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen


The Ascension




On the feast of the ascension we think about Jesus going back to his Father in heaven.




At the time of Jesus people thought the earth was flat. They thought humans lived on the earth and God was in the sky.
