FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2020



If your child is in Year 3 or above, and you would like your child to receive their First Holy Communion in June 2020 you will need to enrol them on the First Holy Communion programme.

The first enrolment date will be on **Tuesday**, **8**th **October** between 3.30pm and 5.00pm, the second enrolment date will be **Tuesday**, **15**th **October** between 6.30pm and 7.00pm. They will both be held in the Sacristy at **Our Lady of Peace Church**. The First Holy Communion classes will begin in **February 2020** and will be held at St Andrew's on Saturday mornings.

Parents will need to complete an enrolment form which will be available at the enrolment meeting. The maximum amount of children we can take is 88, if we reach that number by Sunday, 10^{th} November which will be the deadline date for any enrolments, then any latecomers will have to wait until 2021. If your child was Baptised in another Parish, you will need to bring with you a copy of the child's Baptism certificate: if you cannot find it, you will need to contact the Parish where your child was Baptised and obtain it before the enrolment meeting. **This information can also be found on our website, under parent information, First Holy Communion 2020.**

Message from Dr Gillespie and Mrs Jill Watson

Dear Parent/Carer,

You will no doubt be aware that E-Act Burnham Park Academy closed at the end of last academic year due to the number of students entering Year 7 significantly decreasing over the last 4 or more years, making the school unable to offer a viable secondary curriculum.

This is a sad end to a school with over 50 years of history that has served the Burnham community well for much of its history. At the present time Burnham students will either go to Burnham Grammar School or will go to a secondary school in Slough, Maidenhead or Bourne End Academy, which is also run by E-Act. Many of these schools offer an excellent education, however, as building programmes in Slough and Maidenhead gather pace it is clear that in the near future it is likely that students from Burnham may not be able to gain places in either Slough or Maidenhead secondary schools as they will live too far away. Quite simply there is a very clear danger that children in Burnham may have very limited options for secondary education if they do not attend Burnham Grammar School.

The Trustees of Beeches Learning and Development Trust (BLDT), which is led by Burnham Grammar School, and the Governors of Lent Rise School have been greatly concerned by this situation and the potential impact on the Burnham community. Both have been jointly in discussion with Buckinghamshire County Council, who also share these concerns, and the Regional Schools Commissioner to discuss possible long term solutions. Currently we are discussing the possibility of developing a 'Through' school. If we were to pursue this proposal Lent Rise may join the BLDT; a full consultation in the future would precede any formal decision.

Discussions are at a very early stage but we do need to understand local demand and need for non-selective secondary education to support our vision. We kindly ask that you click on the link below and complete the survey.

We will be hosting a public meeting on **Thursday 10th October 7pm** in Burnham Library to share this information and publicise the survey. Please do not hesitate to talk to us if you require any additional information, but we would like to emphasise that discussions are at an early stage with the Regional Schools Commissioner and we will keep the community informed.

Reminder: Stranger Danger

AT WHAT AGE DO CHILDREN NEED TO KNOW ABOUT STRANGER DANGER?

Children as young as 3 or 4 may begin to have an awareness of what it means for someone to be a stranger and to understand why they should not trust them.

Parents may be concerned about frightening their children by discussing this topic at too early an age. However, most children are now bombarded with media images of missing children and may be reassured by a calm, rational approach to a potentially terrifying subject.

Basic Stranger Danger rules include:

- never go anywhere with a stranger
- never accept gifts or sweets from a stranger
- never get in a car with a stranger
- never go off on your own without telling your parents or a trusted adult
- tell your child it is okay to break the rules if they are in danger
- encourage your child to YELL, KICK, SCREAM, or RUN AWAY, if they feel they are in danger
- give your child a code word or sign that only you and your child (and another parent/carer) know. They can use it when they feel they are in danger but don't want other people to know

TELL YOUR CHILD TO STAY WITH THEIR FRIENDS AND NOT TO GO FOR EXAMPLE: TO THE PARK ON THEIR OWN.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU NEED TO SEND SOMEONE ELSE TO COLLECT YOUR CHILD FROM SCHOOL/SCHOOL CLUBS ETC.

MAKE SURE YOU INFORM THE SCHOOL OR ORGANISATION OF THE NAME OF THE PERSON WHO WILL BE COLLECTING YOUR CHILD. IF POSSIBLE MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD KNOWS WHO WILL BE COLLECTING THEM AND MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD KNOWS WHAT TO DO IF SOMEONE THEY ARE NOT EXPECTING COMES TO COLLECT THEM.



Holiday during Term Time

May we remind you that <u>NO</u> holiday will be authorised at any time during term time and 5 days of absence or more will incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

Any absences attached to a School holiday will need to be backed up with medical evidence, i.e. either an appointment card from the Doctor's surgery to say your child has been seen and please make sure this is dated for the day of absence or proof provided of any prescribed medication. This can be brought to the School Office on your child's return. Without this, your child's absence will be marked as unauthorised and again, if your child is away for 5 days or more (including either side of a School holiday), this could incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

The whole school attendance should be 95% or higher on a regular week. All children should aim for an attendance of 98-100% though as a school we do recognise that children may become unwell so will be absent from school.
