Faith Ambassadors—Serving the Elderly

On Tuesday 18th June the Faith Ambassadors served ladies and gentlemen from 'Contact the Elderly with tea and cakes and class 5KD performed an assembly to our visitors. Please read below a message from Anne Dyer the Burnham Coordinator for Contact the elderly.

Contact the Elderly is a national charity which befriends elderly people, who live alone and usually cannot get out by themselves. The idea is that we arrange through a network of local volunteers to collect them and take them to a hosts' house for afternoon tea. This normally takes place monthly on a Sunday, as this is the loneliest day of the week.

We were approached by Our Lady of Peace School in Burnham, as the children had expressed an interest in doing an afternoon tea, for some of the guests. 16 elderly guests plus their drivers, were treated not only to tea but a delicious array of cakes. The faith ambassadors served the tea and cakes, whilst making conversation with the guests. We were then entertained by Year 5 with an amazing assembly outlining their thoughts on Resilience Kindness and Respect, all enacted out beautifully with volume and clarity. They then sang a wonderful rendition of 'Hey Mr Miller' totally a cappella!!

I have discovered since working with older people, that they seem to 'come alive' when they are among children, and these children did not disappoint, they were relaxed and full of conversation, a great credit to the school. Thank you staff and children for such a delightful afternoon, we all went away feeling very uplifted.

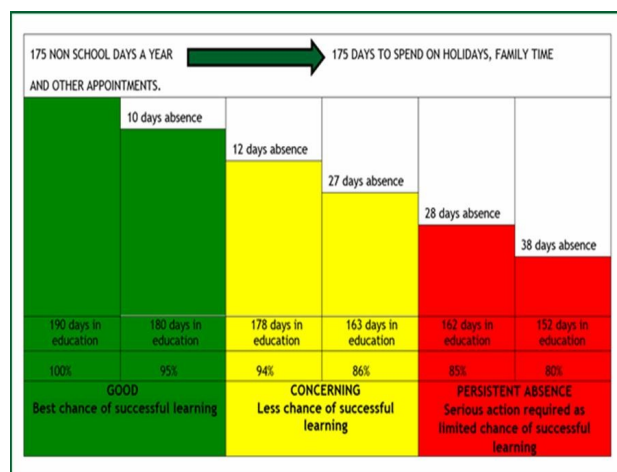

Holiday during Term Time

May we remind you that **NO** holiday will be authorised at any time during term time and 5 days of absence or more will incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

Any absences attached to a School holiday will need to be backed up with medical evidence, i.e. either an appointment card from the Doctor's surgery to say your child has been seen and please make sure this is dated for the day of absence or proof provided of any prescribed medication. This can be brought to the School Office on your child's return. Without this, your child's absence will be marked as unauthorised and again, if your child is away for 5 days or more (including either side of a School holiday), this could incur a penalty notice (fine) from Slough Borough Council.

The whole school attendance should be 95% or higher on a regular week. All children should aim for an attendance of 98-100% though as a school we do recognise that children may become unwell so will be absent from school.
