Values Assembly- Truth Week One

A value is a principle that guides our thinking and behaviour

In March we are going to explore the importance of telling the Truth.



There may be occasions when someone might be tempted to tell a lie. For example, they may seek to get themselves out of trouble; to stop themselves getting into trouble; to get away with something that they have done wrong; or to avoid embarrassment.

Are you telling the truth?



Ask the children to think of reasons why someone might tell a lie. They may suggest some or all of the following.

They are scared of being in trouble. They don't want to let someone down. They are scared of what will happen if they tell the truth.

They feel frightened about telling the truth.

They are embarrassed by the truth.

They wish they could change what they did.

Ask the children how they think a lie could affect another person.

Why do we tell lies?



Ask the children if they have ever initially told a lie, but then later told the truth.

Point out that often, when we tell the truth, we can feel relieved. Even though we might initially get into trouble, at least inside we know that we have done the right thing.

Remind the children that we all have choices to make in our lives. We can make good or bad decisions. We have the choice as to whether we should be honest or tell lies. If we have done something that we know is wrong, the best thing we can do is to tell the truth. If we can't face doing that, we may have to face some hard consequences further down the line.

Making the right choice





The Bible tells us about the importance of honesty. In Proverbs 12.22, it says, 'The Lord detests lying lips, but he delights in people who are trustworthy.'

Time for reflection

Sometimes, we tell a lie and we feel bad about it. Rather than worrying about it, we need to tell the truth, face the consequences and move forward. God always wants to forgive us and give us a second chance. We believe that Jesus died on the cross so that the wrong things we do can be forgiven and we can all have a fresh start.

Tell the truth.



Citizenship is about having rights and responsibilities


Having rights means that there are certain ways that other people should treat you. Following the Golden Rules.

Honest behaviour.


If a friend did not keep a promise or told a lie, how would that make you feel?

Your best friend has bought a new top-she asks you if you like it (You don't) What do you say?


You forgot someone's birthday- do you make up an excuse?

The Boy Who Cried Wolf


Once upon a time, there lived a shepherd boy in a village. He <u>watched</u> a flock of sheep near the village.
