Our children thoroughly enjoyed our author visit on Tuesday, 23rd January. Mr. ER Reilly captivated our children with his hilarious stories and by challenging them to solve the dilemmas in them. In KS2, the children were read extracts from *Harriet the Horrible, The Children's Lottery* and *One Boy, One Dream, One* 

*Club* – the story of a boy wanting to become a professional footballer while facing a moral dilemma. Mr. Reilly ended his presentation by taking questions from the children.

He certainly had the children rolling with laughter at his *Tall Tales* in KS1 and eager to find out more. We have had very positive feedback from our children, who couldn't stop talking about the stories that were read out to them.



Mr. Reilly has truly inspired our children to write their own stories and he has motivated them to read even more.

A pupil from year 2 went home that evening and said to her parents that she wants to become an author when she grows up. How marvellous!

Following up from the visit, we have had an overwhelming response from children and parents, to purchase signed copies of Mr. Reilly's books, on Thursday morning. Our playground was abuzz with excited children and parents. What a great build up to World Book Day on 1<sup>st</sup> March
