Our new topic in RE is Advent. We will be looking at the months of the year and finding out whose birthday is in which month. We will be talking about Christmas being a celebration of Jesus's birthday. The children have been working hard at learning the school prayers. We will be continuing to talk about the properties of shapes and sorting the shapes. The children will be going on a shape hunt to search for 2D shapes such as a triangle, square, rectangle, and circle. They will sort the shapes into large hoops and explore the differences. At home: Continue to look at shapes can you see? Talk about sides and corners. E.g. A triangle has 3 straight sides and 3 corners. The most important part of sharing books is that you and your child enjoy the experience. Books are not just about reading the words but provide opportunities for talking and doing things together. Talking with your child and listening to what they say is vital to their learning. An effective curriculum for young children recognises that they often need to repeat experiences so it is fine for your child to choose the same story/rhyme on a number of occasions. A close home / setting partnership makes a significant difference to a child's progress. Your involvement in your child's learning helps them to succeed.		Literacy We will be reading the story Room on a Broom. The children will be designing their own magical wand to use during their play. They will be making up their own spells and developing their imagination. At home: Design your own props to use when reading a story. You could recycle boxes, card, yoghurt pots or kitchen roll tubes for example.
