



VE DAY VICTORY IN EUROPE

75th anniversary May 8 2020

This marks the end of the conflict in the European theatre of World War II. It was to be marked by great celebrations across the country, and the May Bank holiday was moved to accommodate this. There is still to be a two minute silence at 11am following which Cardinal Vincent will broadcast a livestream Mass from Westminster Cathedral. While we still face the challenges of the CoronaVirus crisis, we need to remember this significant moment in our history, when so many people rejoiced because an end to their crisis was in sight. There was an end to the bombs but the country had still to return to what we are also now calling a “new normal”. In some ways we can see similarities to what was happening then as we face our world here today. As we give thanks for the peace achieved then we can look forward in hope for ourselves. We pray also for all who suffer from war and conflict in our world today, while also facing the danger of CoVid.

O God, who have revealed that peacemakers are to be called your children, grant, we pray, that we may work without ceasing to establish that justice which alone ensures true and lasting peace.

O God, who show a father's care for all, grant, in your mercy, that the members of the human race, to whom you have given a single origin, may form in peace a single family and always be united by a fraternal spirit.

O God, Creator of the world, under whose governance the design for all the ages unfolds, be attentive we pray, to our petitions and grant to our times tranquility and peace that we may exult with unceasing joy in praise of your great mercy.

O God of peace, who are peace itself, and whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp, nor a violent mind receive, grant that those who are one in heart may persevere in what is good and that those in conflict may forget evil and so be healed.

O God, who have taught your Church to keep all the heavenly commandments by loving you and our neighbour, grant us a spirit of grace and peace, so that all your family may be devoted to you wholeheartedly and united in purity of intent.

For those who serve today


O Lord God of Hosts, stretch forth, we pray, your almighty arm
