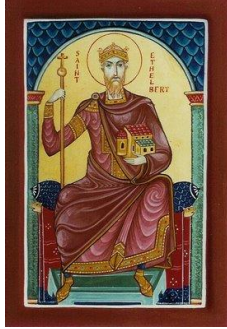
As you will be aware the school has carefully considered the transition of pupils on their return to school in September 2020. Please find additional information relating to this in the booklet below.

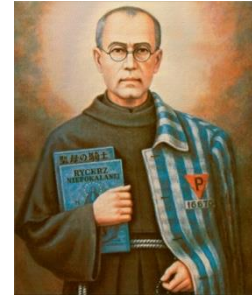

### **Main objectives for your children for this year**

We expect children to be punctual, smart and ready to learn when they come into school. They must always give their best and have a positive attitude to learning at all times. Children should respect themselves and others and adhere to the school's golden rules. It is important to remember that mistakes are not frowned upon but are an opportunity to learn.

### **The school day: Coming in and going home**

In the mornings the children will enter the school building via the KS2 playground between 8.45am-9.05am. If your child needs to be left earlier, we run a breakfast club. Please contact the school office for details.

In the afternoon, your children are brought to the KS2 playground to be collected at 3.10pm. We will not dismiss your child until we see you, or someone you have authorised to collect your child. Please notify us if anyone other than you is collecting your child. If you are running late, children should be collected from the school office.

### **Maths and English**

Children in Year 5 are taught Maths and English every morning. The children are taught in their class groups for English. Maths is taught in a whole-class environment also, where pupils' differing needs are catered for through differentiated activities and effective questioning from the class teacher. Lessons will focus on the pupils' fluency in maths (rapid and accurate recall of number

facts) as well as providing them with the opportunity to build a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts by developing their skills in reasoning and problem-solving.

### **Reading**

We request that reading scheme books and reading diaries are brought into school every day. Please do encourage your children to read regularly and note this in their reading record. Your child will also be allocated books to read on our online reading platform - Bug Club. We do enjoy reading comments from parents about their children's reading. Reading diaries will be checked on a weekly basis to ensure that all children, regardless of reading ability, are reading regularly. We encourage all children to have a reading book of their choice with them in school for when we have quiet reading time. All children will also have the opportunity to choose books from the library with the support of the class LSA once per week, on an allocated day.

### **Homework**

As a result of the feedback from parents, pupils and staff and extensive reading of national research, we have now reviewed our homework procedures for September. Schools across the nation have been reviewing their homework policies, and evaluating the impact homework has on pupil progress. The national research proves that homework does not have an impact on academic progress at primary school level and that schools should be focussing their time on providing first class teaching and learning during the school day. The research also comments that pupils between the ages of 5 - 11 should be using home time to practise social skills and take part in extracurricular activities.

Moving forward our aim is that our school homework provides opportunities for the children to practise key skills and consolidate their learning as well as provide teachers the time to plan and deliver first class lessons every day.

As from September, homework will be split into two categories; Formal Homework and Informal Homework.

**1) Formal Homework** will come into school on the designated days as specified by the class teacher.

Pupils will be tested on their spellings weekly and will be provided with a spelling booklet half termly which will support them with their learning of the spellings. The spelling booklet does not need to come into school and we encourage our parents to check their child's spellings at home.

Brain Builders project work will be marked by the class teacher.

**2) Informal Homework** is optional homework and does not need to come into school as this will be completed at home.

### **Pencil Cases**

It is always very exciting to bring a pencil case into school; however, these can often become a distraction during learning times. In Year 5, children are not required to bring a pencil case to school. Any equipment for lessons will be provided by the class teacher.

### **Water Bottles**

It is very important that the children drink regularly during the day. Please provide your child with a named clear water bottle (no screw caps) containing only water. We have drinking water facilities in every classroom to allow your child to refill their bottles.

### PE Kits

There are two PE lessons during the week; one inside and the other outside. There may be occasions during the year where only one PE lesson is taught during the week. We operate a flexible class timetable at Our Lady of Peace. Children can wear their PE kit to school on the allocated day/s. The PE kit includes a sensible pair of trainers/plimsolls. If your child is in school, they will be expected to participate in games lessons unless a suitable reason is provided by parents.

### Uniform

Make sure everything is named, we prefer no earrings, but if they are worn, they should be silver or gold studs. Children are not allowed to wear earrings for PE, so they must be able to remove them without any adult help. Hair accessories should be simple and in school colours and children are expected to tie long hair back with a plain, school coloured hair tie. During hot weather, please provide your child with a sun hat. If possible, please ensure your child changes their uniform every day.
